We performed surveys and evaluations of the existing fire alarm and sprinkler systems for Georgetown University Hospital, including four high-rise buildings. From our survey, we prepared a report detailing the overall condition of the systems, extent of coverage, expandability, and any major deficiencies resulting from the field investigation. Subsequent to that report, we designed and prepared construction bid documents for a replacement of the existing fire alarm system and extension of the existing fire suppression systems to provide complete sprinkler protection. We successfully negotiated with the Authority Having Jurisdiction to obtain code variances related to firefighter communication and pressure requirements of the standpipe system.

The Joint Commission Statement of Conditions

Koffel Associates is contracted directly by Georgetown University Hospital to survey its buildings for compliance with *NFPA 101, The Life Safety Code*, in order to maintain accreditation by the Joint Commission (TJC). The scope of this work includes:

- A complete life safety/fire protection survey of the entire hospital campus
- Development of a Statement of Conditions report that cited observed life safety/fire protection deficiencies

We continue to provide code consulting services to update and refine the Hospital's Statement of Conditions.
